**PENTECOST OFFERING THIS SUNDAY** supports the Young Adult Volunteers in Washington DC! Your generous donation to the Pentecost offering will help Young Adult Volunteers (YAVs) locate in Washington, D.C. The high cost of living in DC is often a barrier for YAVs to serve with non-profit organizations for the full year. The offering will help young Presbyterians work in churches helping with outreach like Washington Seminar Center or with groups like Capitol Hill Group Ministry and Jubilee Network USA both located on Capitol Hill. YAVs serve for one academic year, August—July, as they explore God's calling in their lives. YAVs are exposed to some of the hardest problems in the world—poverty, violence and reconciliation, and sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ—while living and reflecting with other volunteers on the meaning and motivation of their Christian faith. Our 40% local share of this offering will stay with YAVs in Washington DC.

## **KIDS AT CAPITOL HILL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH**

CHPC Nursery (0-4 years old)

Our nursery has expanded its age range and now welcomes 0-4 year olds. We aim to have 2-3 nursery staff in the nursery each Sunday.

The nursery is available most weeks from 9:45-12:15ish between Labor Day and Memorial Day allowing parents to take advantage of attending an adult Sunday school class if they are interested. In the summer the nursery will be staffed from 9:45-11:15ish.

If you leave your child in the nursery they must stay in the nursery until you collect them. Nursery workers and parent volunteers will not allow children to leave and find their parents during the service. Please don't tell your kiddo they can leave the nursery on their own and come upstairs to find you.

Kids 5+

For kiddos who have aged out of the nursery, but aren't quite ready to sit through a service, we invite you take advantage of the family room upstairs of the sanctuary. There you can listen/watch the service while your kids can play/read/etc. Please remember the church cannot have children wandering around the building without a parent during the service. The nursery workers aren't able to watch those in the room as well as children outside the room and with unlocked front/back doors we need to make sure that everyone is safe. Please make sure your children are supervised by you or another adult at all times while at CHPC.

**CHILDREN'S CHURCH FOR THE 5 AND UPPERS!** - We are introducing a new curriculum targeted to the 5 and up crowd for a Children's Church program each Sunday after the Children's Message.
